

# Curriculum Information Nursery Autumn term

This is a very exciting term for the Nursery Children.

There are new friends to be made and lots of new areas to explore .

*Week 1 is visits with parents.*

*Week 2 is visits alone (if ready- every child is different and some may need additional settling in time)*

*Week 3 your child will be doing their usual hours.*

*Week 3 we will begin our 'Book of the week'. This term we will be doing a mixture of traditional tales and simple classic story books.*

*Reading folders* – If you havent already, please purchase a reading folder from the school office or the Nursery class.

*Reading books are changed on a Monday and a Friday.*

*Reading with your child* at home regually has many benefits, and is also critical this term to prepare them for beginning to read independently in Reception Class next year.

*Good school attendance* is very important for your childs future success ,and having a good routine is vital for childrens wellbeing.

*Please make sure you bring your child to Nursery every day, unless of course they are feeling unwell.*

We will soon have **name cards** with photos for self registration each session. Please encourage your child to find their name each morning.

Please talk to your children at home, and out and about as this will really help their language and understanding of the world. If English is not your first language, please continue to talk to your children in your own language.

When out and about look at numbers and words all around, for example read your street name when walking home. In the car point out a sign that says 30 mph, on a bus ticket show them the price and read any other information.

Please also remember snack money is £1.50 each week.

Stay and Play sessions are on a Friday (beginning week 4) . You, or another family member are invited to stay and play with your child until around 10am. It is also a good opportunity so see your child's strengths and possible weaknesses and also have a chat with members of staff.

Please provide a set of spare clothes in a bag on your child's coat peg in case of any accidents or if their clothes become wet from playing in the water. (this does not need to be uniform)
