School's response:

- Plans are already in place for parents to have the opportunity to observe guided reading sessions in each year group. This will hopefully help parents to support their child with reading at home. The model lessons will take place in the second half of the spring term and in the summer term.
- Mrs Messham will organise a rolling programme of model lessons with subject leaders, so that different lessons can be observed over the academic year.

School's response:

- The school already offers a range of before and after-school activities, including: cookery; tae kwon do; yoga; fitness; sports; cross stitch; board games; choir; computing;
- Gardening club takes place seasonally and will begin again in the spring
- The staff are only able to run a club on one night per week due to their other commitments, such as staff meetings, training etc. Therefore, the school might look into using external providers to deliver some clubs. However, there would be a cost implication for parents.

Parents have the opportunity to see some of our provision through our Facebook page. Do you access this and if so, how can we improve?

Parents' responses:
