We have had a brilliant start to the year. All the children are happy and settled and are quickly getting used to our routines.

Each half term we produce a newsletter which tells you about the things your child will be learning; how you can help at home and anything exciting which might be happening in school.

Book bags

Please could you make sure that your child has a book bag in school? These can be bought in the school office. If your child had one in nursery, please make sure that it is in school before Friday.

Helping at home

Your child will bring home a different library book on Tuesdays and Fridays. Please read through this book with your child, discussing the pictures and story. Books will be changed twice each week, but book bags should be returned every day. Children gain a great deal from hearing a story several times and will often begin to learn to read in this way so please try to read with your child each day.

I will hold a short meeting about how we teach reading in school on Thursday September 19th. This will be in the main school at 2.30. Please try to attend so that you will be able to help your child with their reading. There will be a meeting for writing on Tuesday October 5th and one for maths on Thursday October 10th.

Learning Journeys

Each child has a Learning Journey through which we keep track of their progress. As a parent, you are aware of your child's interests and strengths. We would love to include your contributions in the learning journeys and so welcome any photographs, certificates or comments. At the bottom of this letter there is a slip on which you can write your comments.

Stay and Play

Each Friday parents and carers are invited to stay and play with their child. This is a lovely way for you to learn about how your child is learning through play at school and the children love to show you what they have learned. Children learn much better, when they see their parents enjoy being at school too! There will opportunities for you to see how the children learn and for you to discuss your child's progress. These sessions will begin on Friday 14th

September at 9.00 am. You are welcome to stay for as long as you like and to attend as frequently as you like. We look forward to seeing you!

Many children are able to recognise their names and many of them are attempting to write them. Please encourage your child to write their name with a capital letter at the beginning followed by lower case letters. There is an example stapled to this letter.
