numbers to 100 in numerals and words.

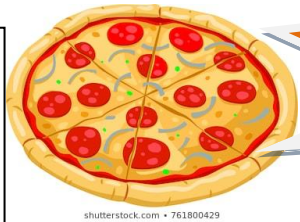
Find 10 more and 10 less than any number up to 100.

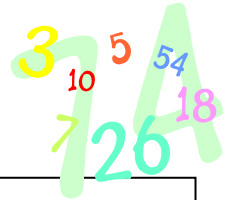
