

Curriculum Information

Nursery- Autumn term

This is a very exciting term for the Nursery Children.

There are new friends to be made and lots of new areas to explore .

Week 1 is visits with parents for 1 hour a day.

Week 2 is 3 hour visits alone (If ready- every child is different and some may need additional settling in time)

Week 3 your child will be doing their usual hours.

Week 3 we will begin our 'Book of the week'. This term we will be doing a mixture of traditional tales and very simple story books.

Each week we will change some of the areas and items in the Nursery, to reflect the childrens changing needs and interests.

We will also learn about the seasons and seasonal events -Autumn, Halloween, Bonfire night, Winter, Advent, Christmas etc.

Each week there will be a variety of adult led activities on offer- this is often linked to the theme of the story of the week. For example if we do the story 'Olivers Vegetables' we would try lots of different vegetables, make vegetable soup and try to grow some vegetables of our own!

Reading folders –are available from, the schoiol office

(Reading books are changed on a Monday and a Friday)

Reading with your child at home regually has many benefits, and is also critical this term to prepare them for beginning to read independently in Reception Class next year.

Good school attendance is very important for your child's future success, and having a good routine is vital for children's wellbeing. Please make sure you bring your child to Nursery every day, unless of course they are feeling unwell.

We will soon have name cards with photos for self registration each session. Please encourage your child to hang up their own coat, wash their hands then find their own name card (with their photo on) each morning.

Please talk to your children at home, and out and about, as this will really help their language and understanding of the world.

If English is not your first language, please continue to talk to your children in your own language, as well as introducing some key English words when possible.

When out and about look at numbers and words all around, for example read your street name when walking home. In the car point out a sign that says 30 mph, on a bus ticket show them the price and read any other information.

Please also remember snack money is £1.50 each week. (or £9 until half term)

Stay and Play sessions are on a Friday (beginning later this term). You, or another family member are invited to stay and play with your child until around 10am. It is also a good opportunity so see your child's strengths and possible weaknesses and also have a chat with members of staff.

Please provide a set of spare clothes in a bag on your child's coat peg in case of any accidents or if their clothes become wet from playing in the water. (this does not need to be uniform if you don't have lots at home)
